The Power of the Resurrection

John 20:1-9

What was it so special about Jesus' resurrection,

especially the burial cloths which he left behind in the tomb?

The resurrection was proof of what Jesus said would happen to him;

his death in Jerusalem and that he would be raised on the third day.

He had made that prediction twice in Matthew 16:21 and 17:22-23;

it would fulfill his claim to die for the sins of all of us to pay the penalty for our sins.

The focus for us is on verses 6b-7, Peter went into the tomb and saw the linen wrappings [neatly] lying there; and the [burial] face-cloth which had been on Jesus' head, not lying with the other linen wrapping but rolled up in a place by itself.

We have always focused on Jesus and not bothered with this powerful evidence left inside the tomb.

V.8, So the other disciple (which was John) went in too; and he saw [the wrappings and the face-cloth] and believed.

What was it about the linen and the face-cloth lying there, where Jesus' body was laid, that caused John to believe Jesus had resurrected?

The best explanation, by the late W. Barclay:

"The grave cloths were not dishevelled...

the linen where the body had been,
the napkin where the head had been.

The whole point... is that the grave clothes did not look as if they had been pulled off;

they were LYING IN THEIR FOLDS AS IF THE BODY OF JESUS HAD SIMPLY EVAPORATED OUT OF THEM..."

There are three key truths we can draw out of this description of the resurrection of Jesus:

1) This is different from the case of Lazarus whom Jesus raised.

He had to tell the people to take off his grave clothes and let him go.

- 2) Because of this amazing fact, John saw and believed, not only the resurrection but the other claims Jesus had made.
- 3) This amazing evidence demonstrated can also inspire the renewal and revival of our spiritual lives, to live powerfully for the glory of God.

John, with the other disciples, had followed Jesus with political hopes, that he would declare himself king and throw out the Romans.

they anticipated a Jewish kingdom and were already jostling for positions in it.

This evidence changed John's focus, to live for the glory of God.

We have often overlooked the amazing details of the burial clothes Jesus left in the tomb;

understanding the power of his resurrection described here for us can inspire a revival in our lives.

Conclusion:

If you are not yet a believer, know that Jesus' death and resurrection are more important and significant than Christmas

which "everybody" celebrates.

Understand what the Bible tells us:

God in his love for humans, sent Jesus to live a perfectly sinless life,

his death on the cross was in payment for the judgement of all our sins,

and his resurrection on the third day would be proof of it.

An empty tomb would be proof enough of Jesus' resurrection for John

but seeing the special evidence of the grave clothes left in that amazing manner,

thoroughly changed the apostle's life and service to God.

Jesus understood the reason for John and the other disciples who followed him then;

he also understood what will happen to many of us, his disciples today,

that in our comfortable faith we will become nominal.

The special manner of the burial clothes
Jesus left behind in the tomb
can be the special reminder for us,

of his power and desire for us to live our lives in spiritual revival.

We need to be transformed to start living for the glory of God.
